- b. A lot of on-line training courses are available
 - 1. Ted will ask Evergreen Chapter for one month notice of courses
 - 2. Alaska Chapter may offer Alaska-specific courses
- c. Lori Aldrich is coordinating a two-hour/day RACEJT RALO May 3rd -14th
- d. Terry Berger will meet with SWANA April 29 about MOLO certification extensions

7. Legislative Liaison – Lori Aldrich

- a. SWANA National is working on two issues
 - 1. Basel Convention
 - a. Additional controls for crossing international boundaries with haz mats
 - b. Cory Hinds says this will affect recyclables, metal and plastic scrap
 - 2. SWANA supporting Congressional legislation for federal recycling standards
 - a. Mark Spafford suggested the Chapter advocate for state recycling regs
 - b. No solid waste legislation currently being advocated
